Later that week, we were walking on the riverwalk just next to campus and I asked him about what he said at the bible study. We had a long conversation where I mostly just heard him and asked questions about the anguish he feels related to his parents, where he is now in life, and where he is in his relationship with Jesus.

It has been a great privilege and honor to get to be with students like Jack and hear

their heartbreaking stories. It's an even greater privilege and honor when God gives the opportunity to share with them how Jesus came to this rebellious, death-filled world, that whoever believes in him would be saved. "For God did not send his Son into the world to condemn the world, but in order that the world might be saved through him."
